- At School: We formally teach Tamil and Hindi to support our largest student groups and to help everyone feel connected to their culture




1.2 The Big Picture: IB Continuum

1.3 Primary Years Programme (PYP)

PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAMME (PYP)

- **How we learn:** We learn language best by using it in real - life situations! You will explore language through your Units of Inquiry.
- **What we learn:** We balance fun with skills, mixing reading, writing, listening, and speaking. You will also get special focus on grammar and usage.
- Your Choices:
 - **Language A:** English (the language of our school).
 - **Language B:** You will choose one additional language (Hindi, German, or Spanish).
 - **Language C:** Everyone learns Tamil to connect with our regional culture.

Pro Tip: In your final PYP year, you will do a Language Carousel to sample different languages before choosing which one to continue in the MYP.

MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME (MYP)

Language & Literature (English)

You will read all kinds of texts - stories, articles, debates - and learn to analyse the choices writers make. You will also learn to organize and produce your own powerful writing and speaking.


How you are assessed:

- Criterion A: Analysing - How well you understand the text.
- Criterion B: Organizing - How well you structure your ideas.
- Criterion C: Producing Text - Your creativity and connection with the audience.
- Criterion D: Using Language - Your accuracy and style.

Language Acquisition

This is your chance to become skilled in another language! You can choose from Hindi, German, or Spanish.

- You learn in Phases (Emergent, Capable and Proficient), not just grade levels. You move up when you are ready!
- You are assessed on Listening, Reading, Speaking, and Writing.
- Tamil is also offered as a language C for everyone, for the state language requisition





1.4 Language in the DP

The DP is your chance to master language for university and beyond. You need to study two languages:

Group 1: Studies in Language & Literature

- This is a deep study of the language that you know best.
- One main offering: English A: Language & Literature.

Want to study a different language A?

You can opt for School -Supported Self -Taught (SSST).

This means:

- You study independently with a mentor from your school guiding you.
- **You will need to hire a qualified tutor.**
- It is a great way to earn a Bilingual Diploma!

Group 2: Language Acquisition

This is your second language. You have options:

- Language B: (Hindi, German, or Spanish): For students with some previous experience. You can take it at Standard or Higher Level.
- Spanish ab initio: For true beginners and no experience in Spanish. A supportive option to start from scratch.



We are here to help! Struggling with academic English? We offer:

- Special support sessions after school.
- Help with essay structuring and vocabulary.
- Tools like graphic organizers to help you plan your writing.

Mother Tongue & Theory of Knowledge (TOK)

- We continue to honour your roots. We offer Hindi in Group 2 and Tamil communicative classes twice a month.
- In TOK, we ask big questions about language: How does the language we speak change the way we think? Is what we know limited by our words?




2.1 Your Superpower Resource: The Library & Beyond
